Benefits of Radio Go-Kits

Having a radio Go-Kit has the following benefits:

- Grab and Go without having to search for items
- Familiarity with the equipment and programming
- Knowledge that the equipment is all functioning
- Having the appropriate forms to record radio traffic
- The ability to move to another location that may not have a radio installed

Types of Radio Go-Kits

There are many types of Go-Kits you can prepare for your radio. They include:

- A handheld radio Go-Kit
- An antenna / coax Go-Kit
- An accessory Go-Kit
- Complete radio set in a box
- A personal items Go-Kit

The Handheld Radio Go-Kit

The handheld radio Go-Kit should contain:

- A handheld radio with attached
 - antenna and battery
- A battery charger with an extra battery
- A lighter adaptor plug
- A SMA to SO-239 adaptor
- A battery adaptor for "AA" size batteries
- A package of "AA" batteries




The Antenna / Coax Go-Kit

To increase the range on a handheld radio, you can use a vehicle antenna. You will need an SMA to SO-239 adaptor

For better 2m/70cm range, the use of a "J" pole antenna or larger base antenna is suggested. These can be mounted on a tripod or other raised base.





Coax Comparison

LMR-400 Least loss Stiff cable

RG-213 2X loss of LMR-400 More flexible

RG-58 4X loss of LMR-400 Very flexible

If the distance from the radio to the antenna is 10 feet or less, RG-58 is sufficient.

If the distance is more than 10 feet, you probably should use RG-213.

50 feet or more, use LMR-400

Coax Carrying and Storage

Your Go-Kit coax can be coiled and held in place by using two sided Velcro strips.



For RG-213 and LMR-400, a large round bag can be used.

For storage, and to keep the ends clean and dry, the coax should have caps placed on both ends.



Antenna / Coax Accessories

One of the primary accessories everyone should have is a roll of electrical tape. This has 1000 uses in ham radio.



Another handy item is two sided Velcro strips. These are 8" x $\frac{1}{2}$ " long with a slot on one end so they can be attached to an item permanently.



Antenna / Coax Accessories cont:

Another very useful item is a barrel connector. These can be used to connect two coax cables if you need a longer coax.



For antenna safety, it is always good to have some safety or reflective tape. This is to protect both people and your antenna wire or coax from damage.
